The Vancouver Aboriginal Child and Family Services Societies CRUW Program brings Aboriginal youth in foster care together with non-Aboriginal inner city youth to engage in culturally relevant land-based practices promoting holistic and sustainable urban wellness. The CRUW program runs for 17-sessions, every second Saturday, at the UBC Farm from March to October.
